Background:

The African Field Epidemiology Network (AFENET) is a not for profit, networking alliance and service organization that brings together field epidemiology training programs (FETPs) across Africa working side by side with Ministries of Health, regional and international partners. AFENET works to strengthen epidemiology and disease surveillance capabilities of African countries that are critical to meeting the requirements of the Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response (IDSR) strategy and the International Health Regulations (IHR).

AFENET, through the US CDC, has been supporting the Sierra Leone Ministry of Health and Sanitation to implement the Sierra Leone Field Epidemiology Training Program since 2016 with the Frontline Level and 2017 with the Intermediate Level of the program. AFENET is currently seeking to recruit highly qualified & experienced FETP mentor for the Sierra Leone Field Epidemiology Training Program.

Summary of Key Functions:

Under the overall direction of the FETP Resident Advisor, the mentor is responsible for the day-to-day facilitation of in-class didactic workshops and field mentorship that include (i) timely development of training and mentorship plans; (ii) review and adapt the training material curriculum; (iii); teach the core and supportive courses of the FETP-Frontline (iii) provide effective field mentorship to the FETP-Intermediate participants;

(iv) prepare timely and quality field mentorship and in-class workshop technical repots and submit to the program; and (v) support FETP-Intermediate participants to identify appropriate field projects vi) provide participants effective technical support to design and implement field projects and also to develop scientific presentation to internal and external audience.

Duties and Responsibilities:

The International FETP Intermediate Mentor will work with the Sierra Leone AFENET team, Sierra Leone FETP and Sierra Leone Ministry of Health and Sanitation to:

- Take active role in coordinating the FETP-Intermediate in-class and field mentorship activities
- Review and adapt the existing Field Epidemiology Training Program (FETP) curriculum and training materials as may be required to suit the specific needs of Sierra Leone
- Facilitate and teach in-class workshops of the core and supplement courses of the FETP curriculum
- Build technical capacities of the national mentors, capacities in teaching, mentoring, planning and implementing surveys, operational research and scientific communications including publication in peer review journals
- Provide effective mentorship, coaching and supervision for the trainees during workshops and field placement periods to ensure acquisition of basic field epidemiology skills and competence
- Facilitate presentations and group exercises during workshops including Continuous professional development workshops
- Provide technical assistance to trainees in preparing their presentations for local and external dissemination of the key findings and recommendations from their field projects
- Participate in disease surveillance, outbreak investigation, group project survey and other relevant activities together with the FETP trainees and other Ministry of Health and Sanitation staff as a means to demonstrate best practices and enhance the skills & competencies of the trainees
